

CHAMPAGNE SKIRT LOGISTICS

Thank you for your booking! People absolutely Love these skirts!

Below you will find important details for the Champagne Skirt(s) at your event. Please share this information with the organizer or venue manager or caterer for the event.

Loading the Champagne Skirt into the Venue

- The skirt breaks into 2 pieces and can be moved through any size door for loading... we usually enter through front doors- but if you need us to use a loading dock or employee elevator- please make that clear to us.
- We like to ensure that guests never see the model getting into or out of the skirt— so we need to ensure that there are double doors for the entrance and exit of the model.

The image part with relationship ID rid7 was not found in the file.

Timing & Location

 Please make it clear to our On-site manager where the skirt is to be placed. The model will be in the skirt about 10 min before 'Go' time so the skirt can get loaded with glasses. o The champagne (or wine or other drinks) should be poured and ready to be placed in the skirt 15 minutes before start time so the model can enter the space on time. Any longer than this and the bubbles start to go flat. It is the responsibility of the client or caterer to open the bottles and fill the glasses with the beverages and this needs to be communicated clearly in advance to avoid delays. We suggest having the bottles corked and iced well before pour time. A refill station placed near where the hostess will be is generally best.

Stocking the Champagne Skirt

- Assuming you have 750ml bottles, see below for the approximate # of bottles consumed per hour:
 - Constellation Skirt (holds 45 glasses): 20 bottles
 - Silver Skirt (holds 75 glasses): 25 bottles
 - Pearl and Gold Skirts (holds 80 glasses): 30 bottles
 - Deluxe Stilt Skirt (holds 120 glasses) 50 bottles
- o It is the responsibility of the client to provide beverages and champagne flutes or wine glasses. They will fit as long as they are standard sized & don't have extra fat or extra long stems. Plan to have a lot of backup glasses as they can disappear very fast.
- The first 20-30 minutes of her appearance requires a lot of refilling.
 We will want to keep the Champagne skirt stocked with glasses because the skirt is a novelty and highly effective at distributing drinks.
- Our onsite manager can refill the skirt but the Caterer/Bartender must provide fresh glasses of bubbly to be put in the skirt and at least 1 dedicated staff member is necessary. For really large events where she is a greeter (400+ people) it is best to have 3 staff helping to open pour and restock the skirts.
- It is ideal to assign one person the role of continually opening bottles and filling glasses.
- Finally- if the event will be crowded it is best to place the refill station near to the skirt is so that the bar staff and our manager

don't need to navigate through the crowd with full glasses to refill skirt.

SUGGESTIONS (totally optional)

We suggest providing fresh fruit along with long toothpicks so the model or guests can place it into their glass. We also recommended providing a non-alcoholic option such as sparkling water or cider for pregnant women and non-alcohol drinkers. 1 row at the bottom works well.
